

OUR HISTORY

In 1978, Madam Emma Boafo was living with Mr. and Mrs. Etta Ernest, an American couple, while caring for six children in Winneba. Rather than use funds the couple gave her for her own education, she chose to care for the children herself — the decision that became Countryside Children's Welfare Home.

During the 1983 drought, she migrated with twelve needy children to Awutu Bawjiase, staying at the Opimbo Chief's Palace. The Home was formally registered in 1994 (Cert. No. 56777), and by 1996 its own house was complete. The Department of Social Welfare granted Recognition No. DSW/1063.

WHAT WE DO



All children receive education, from basic school through Junior High, at the Home.

Older children continue at Senior High, vocational, or technical institutions outside the Home. We stay mindful of every child's individual talents and run programmes to help them grow.

Children take part in regular sporting activities, occasionally hosting matches against schools from neighbouring communities, and learn Ghanaian cultural traditions. Entertainment programmes include excursions and religious functions.

- 7 Building materials to complete our fence wall and gate.
- 8 Partnerships offering vocational and technical training for our young adults.
